
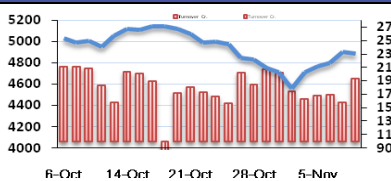

MARKET PREVIEW

China's industrial production and retail sales accelerated in October, bolstering forecasts for economic growth to exceed 10% this quarter for the first time in more than a year. Production rose 16.1% from a year before, the most since March 2008, the statistics bureau said in Beijing today. Retail sales gained an annual 16.2 % in October, and urban fixed-asset investment climbed 33.1% in the first 10 months of this year, it said. The increase in industrial output was more than economists' median forecast for a 15.5% gain and retail-sales growth was also ahead of estimates. The Shanghai Composite Index pared losses, falling 0.2% at 10:10 a.m. local time after a drop of as much as 0.7%.

Besides building 270,000 low-rent homes, 200,000 kilometers of rural roads and nearly 1,500 kilometers of railway under a \$586 billion stimulus plan, China's government has pressed banks to lend, flooding the economy with cash. The World Bank cautioned last week that the nation may risk asset bubbles and a "misallocation of resources."

The dollar fell to a 15-month low versus major counterparts as growing industrial production and retail sales in China boosted demand for higher-yielding assets.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average climbed to a 13-month high for a second day as American Express Co. and Bank of America Corp. rallied. Most U.S. stocks fell following six straight gains for the Standard & Poor's 500 Index as earnings disappointed investors at companies from MBIA Inc. and Fluor Corp. to Electronic Arts Inc. MBIA, the world's largest bond guarantor, tumbled 27 % after posting a \$727.8 million loss on insured credit derivatives.

Of 430 companies in the S&P 500 that reported quarterly earnings since Oct. 7, 83% exceeded estimates, according to data compiled by Bloomberg.

Japan's machine orders, an indicator of business investment in three to six months, climbed 10.5 % in September after gaining 0.5% in August, Japan's Cabinet Office said today in Tokyo. The median estimate of 25 economists surveyed by Bloomberg was for a 4.1% gain.

Asian stocks rose, driving the MSCI Asia Pacific Index higher for a fourth day, after Japan's machinery orders increased more than economists expected and shipping rates climbed.

RIL scouts Madhya Pradesh for diamonds

Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) is trying its hand at searching for what some consider being the carbon derivative that is the hardest to find—diamonds. The company, which announced an oil discovery in Gujarat on Tuesday, recently launched an initial survey of a 1,800 sq. km area in Madhya Pradesh (MP) after getting licences to do so from the state government. Analysts are ambivalent about the potential and prospects of the business, but executives in the diamond trade are enthusiastic at private miners such as RIL finding an indigenous supply of rough diamonds. Rallis completes journey as new subsidiary of Tata Chem

Pesticide maker Rallis India is now a subsidiary of Tata Chemicals. The latter acquired a further 4.09 per cent stake in Rallis, part of the Tata Group and one of the oldest major private sector companies in the country, for about Rs 89 crore to make it a subsidiary. Tata Chemicals has acquired 980,000 shares at Rs 908.51 a share, inclusive of premium of Rs 898.51 a share, through a preferential allotment yesterday. (BS)

Wipro eyes acquisition in BPO space

Wipro Technologies Ltd said on Tuesday that it is looking for an acquisition in the business process outsourcing (BPO) space, which is likely to be the next engine of growth for the information technology (IT) industry. "The economy has improved. The IT demand situation is certainly improving. The deal pipeline is good, the demand environment is building up," joint chief executive officer Suresh Vaswani said. (Livemint)

Punj Lloyd seeks more highway projects

Engineering, procurement and construction company Punj Lloyd Ltd, which has interests in construction for the oil and gas, thermal power and civil infrastructure industries, wants to increase its highways portfolio in India, company chairman Atul Punj said. The company is looking to participate in projects covering 2,000-3,000km over the next six months, Punj said. (Livemint)

Bajaj fails to get its name on ultra-low cost car

Renault/Nissan alliance on Tuesday finalized a deal with Bajaj Auto to produce an ultra-low cost car by 2012, though denying 'hamara Bajaj' a place in the badging of the car. Renault/Nissan boss Carlos Ghosn, said he had worked out the broad contours of a highly fuel-efficient ultra low-cost (ULC) car project with Bajaj MD Rajiv Bajaj that would be out by 2012 (delayed by one year), though refusing to confirm whether the companies had signed a formal joint venture detailing concrete investment and production plans. "There would be no Bajaj name on the badge of the car," Ghosn asserted. It may be noted here that the project — announced in 2008 — has already been delayed, understandably due to differences between the partners on a host of issues, including badging, designing and positioning of the vehicle. (ET)

Labour-intensive sectors may get more export sops

The government is likely to announce more sops to exporters engaged in labour-intensive sectors like engineering, minister of state for commerce and industry Jyotiraditya Scindia said on Tuesday. Talking to reporters on the sidelines of India Economic Summit, Mr Scindia said the commerce ministry has kept some funds aside for helping exporters in distress out of the budgetary allocations. (ET)

India, US spat intensifies on quantity checks on 'open' boric acid imports

The tussle between the US and India over the "restrictions" on imports of boric acid — a chemical used as insecticide and also in antiseptics, flame retardants and as a controlling agent for uranium fission — has intensified. The US has rejected the explanation given by India at the WTO that there is nothing wrong with the country's import licensing procedure for the chemical as it is through the automatic path. Automatic import licensing is where approval of application is granted in all cases. (ET)

Sugar output in UP likely to dip marginally in 2009-10

Sugar production in Uttar Pradesh is likely to decline marginally at nearly 40 lakh tonne as the sugarcane area is estimated to have dipped by 17 per cent in 2009-10 seasons with more farmers switching to other crops. In 2008-09 seasons (October-September), production stood at 40.64 lakh tonne. "The total cane area of the state, which was 21.4 lakh hectare in the last crushing season, is estimated to reduce to 17.88 lakh hectare this year," a senior official at UP Cane Development Department said. (ET)

Coal min. notice to GMDC, may deallocate coal blocks

The coal ministry has issued a showcause notice to Gujarat Mineral Development Corporation (GMDC) for delay in developing the Naini and Morga II coal blocks allotted to the state PSU in 2006. The Union government had allotted Morga II block in Chhattisgarh to GMDC, while Naini block in Orissa was allotted to it jointly with Pondicherry Industrial Promotion Development and Investment Corporation (PIPDICL). (BS)

Portfolio funds see growth opportunity in Rural India

Rural India has found a new ally in venture capitalists (VCs) and private equity (PE) funds. Moving away from chic sectors like IT and real estate, portfolio funds are making a beeline to invest in social projects for the economically backward. Micro-credit firms and microfinance companies, which invest in social projects involving rural poor, are witnessing large capital inflows from strategic investors. According to microfinance industry estimates, the segment that includes micro-equity investments, has received over Rs 3,000 crore of PEVC funds in the past three years. Inflows into microfinance schemes and other social projects have resulted in lending touching \$15 billion in 2008. As per PE tracker Venture Intelligence rolls, PE firms have invested about Rs 200 crore in 2009, 21% lower than the same period last year. (ET)

Banks Face Renewed Risks as Unemployment Rises, Zoellick Says

Banks around the world face renewed risks as global unemployment rates rise, making it more difficult for consumers to repay loans, World Bank President Robert Zoellick said. The global economy and financial markets are experiencing a "revival" even as growth is likely to be slow, Zoellick said at a conference in Singapore today. The recovery won't be symmetrical around the world. East Asian policy makers that have traditionally followed the Federal Reserve may face challenges as the U.S. central bank pledges to hold interest rates near zero for an "extended period," Zoellick said.(Bloomberg)

Japan Machine Orders Rise More Than Expected; Recovery May Last

Orders for Japanese machinery rose more than twice the pace economists estimated in September, signaling that a recovery in the world's second-largest economy may be sustained. Orders, an indicator of business investment in three to six months, climbed 10.5 % from a month earlier, the Cabinet Office said today in Tokyo. (Bloomberg)

Apple tops phone chart as Nokia, Samsung step up

The world's two largest cellphone makers, Nokia and Samsung Electronics, unveiled on Tuesday their latest rivals to the iPhone as Apple became the top profit generator in the handset industry. Nokia and Samsung together sell around 60 % of all cellphones globally, but they have lost some ground to Apple and Research In Motion Ltd, maker of the Blackberry. Apple sold 7.4 million iPhones during the July-September quarter, generating sales of \$4.5 billion. Nokia sold 108.5 million phones in total in the same quarter, generating sales of 6.9 billion euros (\$10.36 billion), but its profits were hurt by the economic downturn. (ET)
