


L&T plans big play in wind, hydro power generation

The country's largest engineering company with large thermal-fired power projects is going green by venturing into wind and hydro power generation. The company has prepared a road map for building wind power projects in Gujarat, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu for captive use. It is also investing around Rs 8,000 crore for setting up 700-800 MW of hydro power projects in HP, Uttarakhand and Arunachal Pradesh. The projects would go on stream in the next four-five years. (ET)

Spice Mobiles to own 65% in JV with Malaysia's CSL

Spice Mobiles is picking 65% equity in a new joint venture that will own Asian smartphone brand Blueberry, besides the mobile handset and netbook-manufacturing units of Malaysia's CSL Mobile for around \$25 million. CSL, a privately-held company, which is believed to have annual revenues of \$180 million, will transfer its assets to the JV firm in which it would own 35%. (ET)

DRL to move 25% more Betapharm production to India

Dr Reddy's Laboratories is shifting production of more drugs from its German subsidiary, Betapharm, to India to remain competitive. Since all the medicine supply contracts it had managed to get in Germany were for products it sources from India, Dr Reddy's has decided to shift the production of 25 per cent more of Betapharm's products to India in about six months. (BS)

Dishman joins hands with Californian firm

Ahmedabad based Contract Research and Manufacturing Services major Dishman Pharmaceuticals and Chemicals Ltd has entered into a strategic alliance with California based biotechnology firm Codexis, Inc. that will allow Dishman to use of Codexis' proprietary enzymatic biocatalysis technology to manufacture intermediates and active pharmaceutical intermediates. (BS)

Adani Group plans port, industrial zone in Orissa

Adani Group is keen on setting up a large port in Orissa coast and developing an industrial zone, including a power plant, at mammoth investment of Rs 98,000 crore. With an initial investment of Rs 5,000 crore, the company has proposed to start the first phase of the Rs 10,000-crore port project in 2013-14 and complete it by 2015-16. (BS)

CIL to offer coal to Hindalco at 10% premium

Coal India (CIL) said it has agreed to provide coal linkage from its Krishnasila coal mines to Hindalco's Renukut captive power plant at a premium of 10 per cent from base price. The total value will be around Rs 300 crore per annum for providing 5-6 million tonnes of coal per annum. (BS)

HPCL to focus on rural retail business

HPCL said it is planning to increase the number of retail outlets in rural areas, which generate over 20 per cent of its topline. The Company wants to increase the number of retail outlets to 9,000 by next year from the existing 8,500. It also want to increase the number of rural outlets to 2,000 in the next one year. (BS)

Godrej scouts for domestic, intl acquisitions

Godrej Consumer Products said it is in talks with some domestic and international firms and plans to acquire them within the next 12 months. The company took an approval from its board in an enabling resolution to raise up to Rs 3,000 crore through debt and equity for mergers and acquisitions. (BS)

Govt amends ferliser policy; urea to cost 10% more

The government decided to increase urea prices by 10 per cent and gave freedom to industry to fix prices of other fertilisers. It has been decided to increase the maximum retail price of urea from Rs 4,830 per tonne to Rs 5,310 per tonne with effect from April 1, 2010. Industry has assured the government that fertiliser prices would not be raised for the coming kharif season and maintain them at current level. (BS)

India to have Nanotechnology Regulatory Board soon

The Nano Mission Council said the country will soon have a Nanotechnology Regulatory Board to regulate the industrial nanotech products that are used in day-to-day life. "We are in the process of forming a regulatory body for the nanotechnology and this will be called Nanotechnology Regulatory Board," Nano Mission Council Chairman C N R Rao said. (BS)

Inflation to stand at 8.5% by March-end: RBI

The Reserve Bank of India said it would stick to its projection of inflation standing at 8.5 per cent by the end of the current fiscal, even as rate of price rise has already breached the central bank's target. "Monitoring inflation is a continuous process. We still stand by that inflation will be at 8.5 per cent, as projected, by March 2010," RBI Governor D Subbarao told. He, however, said it was difficult to predict a precise roadmap now "but we expect that inflation would moderate by July 2010". RBI has scaled up its target for inflation to 8.5 per cent from an earlier estimate of 6.5 per cent. (BS)

Centre grants Rs 1,133-cr for upgrading states tax system

The Centre approved a Rs 1,133-crore project for computerisation of states' taxation system, a move that would help them gear up for the roll-out of the goods and services tax. The project would help the states develop and upgrade their IT systems in their commercial taxes administrations, adding commercial taxes constitute up to two-thirds of a state's revenue. The focus of the project is to provide an improved set of services to the dealers and better the efficiency of the commercial taxes administrations of states. (BS)

Disinvestment strategy should get more space

One non-tax revenue source that Union Finance Minister is expected to bank upon while providing for social sector projects in the coming Budget is disinvestment. The change in the utilisation norms for the National Investment Fund (NIF) ensure capital expenditure in this regard will directly benefit from stake sale through public issues of government-owned companies. (BS)

U.S. Economy: Manufacturing Is Generating Momentum

Manufacturing will remain at the forefront of a U.S. economic recovery that's likely to extend at least through the middle of the year as companies invest in new equipment. The New York-based Conference Board's measure of the outlook for the next three to six months increased 0.3 percent in January. The Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia's general economic index rose to 17.6 in February from 15.2 as a measure of orders surged to the highest level in more than five years. Readings greater than zero signal growth. (Bloomberg)

Taiwan Economy Probably Exited Deepest Recession

Taiwan's economy probably exited the deepest recession on record last quarter as the global recovery spurred demand for the island's semiconductors and mobile phones, according to a survey of economists. Gross domestic product increased 7.1 percent in the three months through December from a year earlier, the median of the Bloomberg News survey's nine estimates shows, after contracting for the previous five quarters. President Ma Ying-jeou is negotiating a trade accord with China that would cut import duties on Taiwanese goods in the world's fastest growing major economy and help cement the recovery. (Bloomberg)

Argentina Won't Have Inflation Goal, Bank Chief Says

Argentina's central bank won't have an inflation target and will instead focus on helping companies boost output amid signs that price increases are accelerating, bank President Mercedes Marco del Pont said. "The phenomenon of price increases is related to what happens on the supply side with bottlenecks and lower productivity," Marco del Pont told. (Bloomberg)

The Federal Reserve Board raised the discount rate charged to banks for direct loans by a quarter point to 0.75 percent and said the move will encourage financial institutions to rely more on money markets rather than the central bank for short-term liquidity needs. "These changes are intended as a further normalization of the Federal Reserve's lending facilities," the central bank said. (Bloomberg)

Singapore Sees Economy Expanding 4.5% to 6.5% in 2010

Singapore's government said the economy will expand faster than initially expected this year, adding to evidence of a sustained regional recovery that has prompted policy makers to end some stimulus measures. Gross domestic product will increase 4.5 percent to 6.5 percent in 2010 after shrinking 2 percent last year, the trade ministry said in a statement today. That compares with a previous prediction for growth of 3 percent to 5 percent this year. (Bloomberg)
